### **Teaching and Designing**

### **Academic Monitoring**

- One-on-one meetings and grade checks on School Loop
- Assist in setting goals and followingthrough on them, with respect to postsecondary academic goals
- Instruct on grades necessary for college



### **College Field Trips**

Plan, file appropriate paperwork, and chaperone class-wide field trips to at least two colleges

### **Supporting College Team**

Reinforce information from presentations and check-ins from College Prep Team in the following wavs:

- Support completion of college list and decision for 4-year vs. 2-year
- Collect data for EAP status
- Recommend advisees for college representative visits
- Track community service hours
- Conduct unofficial a-g checks
